All entries will be on display at the Centennial Celebration, March 10th. Cards must be able to be fitted into a standard 11x14 manila envelope.

Deadline for the contest is 12 o'clock, noon, Wednesday, February 28th.

All entries must be legible, original and clearly identified with your name and contact information. Only one entry per person. All legitimate entries will have a chance to win a cash prize during a drawing after the five first place winners are announced. The first place winners will each receive a \$100 dollar bill. All winners will be announced and prizes awarded March 10th at 4 pm. during Miami's Centennial Birthday Party to be held at Bullion Plaza Museum and Cultural Center.
